



At the Jurys Inn Derby hotel we embrace our Corporate and Social Responsibility to protect our environment and to support the local community. We are committed to reducing our negative impact on nature, resources and society whilst providing our guests and staff with a comfortable and high quality environment.

The core environmental aims and beliefs of Jurys Inn Derby are being put into objectives and guidelines and these have an effect on all areas of our business.

With the aim of becoming a “Green” Hotel, awarded by the Green Tourism Business Scheme, we at Jurys Inn Derby are undertaken the following:

- *We segregate and recycle paper, cardboard, glass, plastic, cans and cooking oil. Along with this we recycle fluorescent and long life bulbs, batteries and printer toner and cartridges.*
- *To reduce paper waste and printer energy, all brochures unless requested are emailed, this is working in conjunction with our ‘think before you print policy.’*
- *The hotel works with suppliers who operate under set environment policies to reduce packaging waste and lessen the carbon footprint.*
- *We only use the most environmentally acceptable cleaning products, from which phosphates have been eliminated and packaging is minimised.*
- *We support charity organisations and the local community by recycling commercial waste, IT waste, blankets, clothing, mobile phones and stamps. In 2009 we plan to participate in litter pickings in Derby.*
- *We are actively pursuing the reduction of energy and water throughout the hotel. This has been achieved by placing water restrictors on all our showerheads, taps and toilet flushes. The hotel also has solar panels that help preserve and provide renewable energy and operate a ‘lights out policy when bedrooms or offices are vacant.*
- *By raising awareness, we encourage participation from staff and customers. All staff have been trained on sustainable business practices.*
- *As a preferred form of travelling, we promote public transport, cycling or walking. We aim to reduce the impact of vehicle emissions by guests and staff.*
- *In April 2009 we joined the Green Tourism Business Scheme (GTBS) as an indicator of our sustainable aims and practices.*
