



Green Policy

At Jurys Inn Croydon we are committed to reducing our negative impact on nature, resources and society whilst providing our guests and staff with a comfortable and high quality environment.

The core environmental aims and beliefs of Jurys Inn Croydon are being put into objectives and guidelines and these have an effect on all areas of our business.

With the aim of becoming a “Green” Hotel, awarded by the Green Tourism Business Scheme, we are undertaking the following actions:

- *We are minimising the use of materials by recycling and reusing newspaper, office paper, cardboard, glass, plastic and cans. Along with this we recycle fluorescent and long life bulbs, batteries, cartridges and metal hangers.*
- *We are working with suppliers who have good environment policies to reduce packaging waste.*
- *We only use the most environmentally acceptable cleaning products, from which phosphates have been eliminated and packaging is minimised.*
- *We support charity organisations and the local community by recycling commercial waste, IT waste, blankets, clothing, mobile phones and spectacles. In 2009 we have been participating in litter pickings in Croydon.*
- *We are actively pursuing the reduction of energy and water throughout the hotel. This has been achieved by placing water restrictors on all our showerheads, taps and toilet flushes. Our goal is to achieve a 5% energy saving each year on total water, electricity and gas.*
- *By raising awareness, we encourage participation from staff and customers. All staff have been trained on sustainable business practices.*
- *As a preferred form of travelling, we promote public transport, cycling or walking. We aim to reduce the impact of vehicle emissions by guests and staff.*
- *In April 2009 we joined the Green Tourism Business Scheme (GTBS) as an indicator of our sustainable aims and practices.*
